This is a special workshop, collaboratively planned by the IAUD and the HHRC, which is based on their footprint.

Participants, drawn from within the IAUD and from the list of registrants for "The 2nd International Conference for Universal Design in Kyoto 2006", are divided into five teams, each of which is led by a professional British designer from a member company of the DBA who has participated in the DBA Inclusive Design Challenge.

The brief will be revealed on the day and the teams will participate in a design competition based on it, within a 48 hour time limit. The first 24 hours will be devoted to issue extraction, brainstorming and design development while the remaining 24 hours are spent synthesizing the design and producing a six minute presentation.

At the workshop venue, a number of disabled participants with a variety of physical and sensory characteristics will be on hand to advise the teams.

On the final day open presentations will be made at the International Conference and awards for the best designs will be made after public judging by conference participants.

Team composition 1

Each team shall be composed of the following 7 members:

Team leader (1), Sub-leader (1), Team members (5)

Team Leaders:

Five professional designers have been invited from The UK to lead each of the teams.

All will have past experience of participation in the DBA Inclusive Design Challenge.

The team leaders will consult with their team members to steer them towards a solution and help formulate its presentation.

Selection is as follows:

Sub -leaders:

One sub-leader will be selected by mutual voting within the team. The sub-leader shall assist the leader and manage the team.

Team members:

Thirty young designers, planners and researchers, drawn mainly from among IAUD members and "The 2nd International Conference for Universal Design in Kyoto 2006" registrants will be divided into five teams of mixed disciplines. No team shall have more than two members from the same company. Team recruitment and composition will be handled by the Executive Committee or the Secretariat.

It is preferable that participants bring along a lap-top computer with the software that they are accustomed to using and will require for visualization and presentation of ideas.

Team Composition 2

Disabled participants:

People with a varying types and degree of physical and sensory disabilities will be present. They will work with a particular team and offer specific and unbiased advice and brainstorm with team members. This will include their relationship with products, services, communication materials and environments, the problems they experience and their aspirations as consumers. In principle, these members will be Kyoto residents who live independently. The Tanpopo-No-Ye Foundation will be asked to make the selection.

- 1. Wheel-chair users
 (with cervical vertebral injury at C7-8, or lumbar vertebral injury at L1)
- 2. Users (with muscular dystrophy ,cerebral palsy or severe arthritis)
- 3. Hemiplegics (with right or left hemiplegia)
- 4. Visually-impaired persons (with profound blindness or impaired vision)
- 5.Hearing-impaired persons (with deaf-mutism< THIS WILL BE QUITE DIFFICULT TO HANDLE> or impaired hearing)*
 - *The IAUD will arrange for Japanese Sign Language interpreters
- 6. People with restricted growth

Student Assistants (volunteers):

Up to four student assistants will be attached to each team in a support capacity. They will undertake three separate roles: interpreting support for the British designers, design work support, and presentation production support. As such each must possess skills commensurate with their role. Student assistants may also be allocated, where required, to care for disabled participants.
